STRONG HINTS FOR SPEECH WRITING

1. Your first draft is <u>never, never, never</u> your best.

No matter how good you think it is.

- 2. Write every speech out in <u>full</u>. If you don't, how can you possibly edit it?
- 3. Edit severely. Make each word fight for its place. The result will be a tightly-written speech. Rule of thumb: number of words in any speech = 'lower time limit in minutes' X 100 This will allow time for pauses/ laughter/ etc
- 4. Determine to make each speech 5% better than previous best. Adopt as a motto: "I will reach beyond my grasp."
- 5. Include stories Tell us the <u>point</u> each makes that links with your theme.
- 6. Be certain the speech opens so as to grab our attention. Know 1st paragraph by heart. Question/quotation/statement.
- 6. The ending must link with the opening/message. It must be strong and fluent. If using notes, avoid them during ending.
- 7. Rehearse your speech very often. In 3 sections. A different section per day.

This avoids the common trap of having only the opening very well embedded. The Body & Ending are VITAL.

8. Get the best mentor you can. When you find a better one, change. Those who are almost World Champions have mentors.
